ABOUT THE MADALAH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

MADALAH Limited is a not-for-profit organisation that offers secondary and tertiary education scholarships for Indigenous students from remote and regional communities to Western Australia's leading boarding schools and Australian universities.

We believe education is the key to generational change and opportunity, and we are committed to making a difference in the lives of our students, their families and communities.

If you were to be successful in receiving a secondary scholarship the scholarship funds are to be utilised in the first instance for:

Schools Fees / Tuition

If after school fees / tuition have been covered and there is a surplus of scholarship funding, the surplus can be utilised for the following and must also align with any school policies:

- Boarding & Accommodation
- Uniforms, Textbooks, Stationery & IT Equipment
- School Leadership, Cultural or Sporting Camps/Tours
- Tutoring, Mentoring Or Counselling
- Personal Expenses (e.g. health & hygiene)

Please note that not all of the above will be covered by the scholarship. Contact your chosen partner school/s to find out what the gap might look like for your family.

The MADALAH Scholarship funds are paid directly to the school in two instalments, half at the start of Semester 1 and the other half at the start of Semester 2.

If your child is eligible for ABSTUDY, this is also paid directly to the school and will be utilised first

MADALAH will liaise with your school/s of choice and the school/s will complete their order of preference following their own selection criteria. MADALAH will then allocate scholarships in line with contractual obligations and the school/s selection criteria.

Should you not be successful with attaining a scholarship you should seek feedback from the school directly.

2025 SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

OPEN: Wednesday 1st November 2023 **CLOSE:** Friday 26th July 2024

WHO CAN APPLY & FLIGIBILITY CRITFRIA

- Be of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent and provide proof of descent.
- Be eligible for ABSTUDY and/or demonstrate some form of disadvantage, e.g; financial, geographic etc and provide proof.
- Apply to one or more of our partner schools and provide proof of offer or enrolment where you have it.

(This proof will be required before a scholarship can be awarded, but does not have to be supplied at time of applying. If applying to multiple partner schools please note on the application your order of preference.)

- Provide most recent academic results.
- Provide one letter from a referee.
- Applicants must have a good school attendance and behaviour record.
- Applicants must have a home location in Western Australia.

Proof of descent can be one of the following documents:

- Letter from an Indigenous Corporation or Land Council.
- Parent's or Grandparent's proof of descent and child's birth certificate.
 (If submitting proof of descent for a grandparent we will also require the parent's birth certificate.)

Proof of ABSTUDY Entitlements or Proof of Disadvantage

If you are not already in receipt of ABSTUDY please apply as soon as possible as this process can take several weeks.

We are aware that in some cases you are not able to apply to ABSTUDY until approximately 13 weeks prior to the commencement of term one.

You will also be asked if you consider yourself to be disadvantaged and to determine whether this is due to financial, geographic or other reasoning; supporting documentation will be required.

For example, a recent tax return if you consider yourself to be disadvantaged due to financial strain or proof of address if you consider yourself to be disadvantaged due to location.

If applying because you consider yourself disadvantaged in any other way please provide further detail at time of applying.

HOW TO APPLY & **APPLICATION PROCESS**

HAVE YOU ENROLLED INTO A MADALAH PARTNER SCHOOL?

Contact a MADALAH partner school (listed on the MADALAH website) and go through the enrolment process for your child.

Speak to the Enrolments Officer or the Indigenous Liaison Officer who can provide more information about the school and offer support with enrolment.

Please note: you will not be eligible for a scholarship if you have not applied to at least one of our listed partner schools. Our selection process is school-led and securing a place at one of our partner schools is a requirement.
